CHAPLEAU, Hon. JOSEPH ADOLPHE, Q.C., LL,D., P.C. (Terrebonne.)

Ancestors came from France, and were early settlers in the Seigniory of Terrebonne. B. at Ste. Therèse de Blainville, Terrebonne, P. Q., 9 Nov., 1840. Ed. at the Coll. of Terrebonne and at St. Hyacinthe. M., 25 Nov., 1874, Marie Louise, dau. of Lt.-Col. King, Sherbrooke. Called to the Bar, L.C., 1861. Created Q.C., 1873. Created a Commander of the Legion of Honor (France), 10 Nov., 1882, and of the Order of St. Gregory the Great (Roman) A dir. of the Pontiac and Pacific Junction Railway 1881. Co., and of Le Crédit Foncier Franco-Canadien. Has been a Professor of the Laval Univ. (Criminal Jurisprudence) and is now Professor of International Law in the section established in Montreal. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council and Solicitor-General from 27 Feb., 1873, until 8 Sept., 1874, when the Government resigned. Apptd. Prov. Secy. and Registrar 27 Jan., 1876, which position he held until the dismissal of Govt. by Letellier de St. Just, 1878. Became leader of the Conservative Opposition, and was called upon to form a Govt., when Mr. Joly resigned, on the 30 Oct., 1879. Was Premier and Minister of Railways and of Agriculture and Public Works until he resigned to enter the Dominion Government. Sworn of the Privy Council and apptd. Secy. of State of Can., in succession to Hon. J. A. Mousseau, who succeeded him as Premier of P-Q., 29 July, 1882. Apptd. a Commr. 4 July, 1884, and proceeded to B. C. for the purpose of investigating and reporting on Chinese Immigration into Canada. Unsuccessfully contested Verchères for House of Commons at g.e., 1872. First returned to Leg. Assem. for Terrebonne, by acclamation, at g.e., 1867; re-elected by acclamation at ge, 1871, and again on his appt. to office in 1873. Again returned at g.e., 1875, and by acclamation, on his second appt to office in the De Boucherville Govt. in 1876. Re-elected at g.e., 1878, also on accepting office in 1879, and again at g.e., 1881. Elected for Terrebonne in the House of Commons, 23 Aug., 1882, and again at g.e.. 1887. CHARLTON, JOHN. (North Norfolk.)

Father came from Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Eng., in 1824. B. near Caledonia, N. Y., 3 Feb., 1829. Ed. in New York. Came to Can. with his father's family, in 1849,
