Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the following Petition was read:

Of the Great Western Railway Company of Canada; praying for the passing of an Act to provide for the consolidation and concise exposition of the powers now possessed by the said Company; and also that candidates for the position of Director when vacancies occur be required to give public notice of their desire to be elected.

The Honorable Mr. Campbell acquainted the House that he had a Message from His Excellency the Governor General under his sign manual, which His Excellency had commanded him to deliver to this House.
