

Mr. Torben Hunter's house. This man arrived in Canada on August 1st, 1927 and purchased a farm near Mr. Schmidt for \$1,300. This farm is about 350 acres in area and Mr. Hunter bought at a bargain price. He bought under the same terms as Mr. Schmidt and had the money he brought from Denmark to purchase stock and equipment. Mr. Hunter did not arrive in time to plant any crop but has made good use of his time in ploughing and putting the land in shape for this spring (1928) He has about thirtyfive acres ploughed and drained which will give him a good start. He has one cow, two pigs, two calves and twenty hens which supply the femily with milk, eggs, butter and meat. He can live very cheaply with what he has on the farm and only has to buy clothing and groceries. Mr. Hunter is well satisfied with Canada and values the farm be bought six months ago for \$1,300 at \$2,500 to-day.
