

Department is enforced, a good law was  
 derived, the contractor evidently well acquainted  
 of the fact that there were no instructions, to  
 deliver what he thought proper at Duck  
 Lake, and at the Industrial School, Buffalo  
 6<sup>th</sup> July 1891. No mention of size, in this  
 case; and the contractor no doubt considered  
 the 3 inch tri-square the largest he could  
 give for the price.

In none of these cases does it appear  
 that the Department has any reason  
 against the contractor, or that any abatement  
 of price would be justified, if the question  
 were referred to a Court of law; and for  
 similar reasons, i.e. want of description, the  
 iron-chests delivered cannot be rejected.

The proposed reduction of six cents  
 each may be made from the contract price
