Dear Mr Avery

February 18/34

I am writing you asking you if you could give my boy Redfern his treaty money at Chaplain this coming summer that is if it can be done

I know Mr Avery there is some thing I am asking you I think I told you last summer that I was getting 28⁰⁰ of a pension from the HBCoy well it just keeps me in Rations but I am not able to get any clothing out of it for my family am pretty hard up for clothing my self and my boy my woman are not too badly off there are able to help them selves by doing fancy needle work so if you have any old clothing the kind that you people in the City Burn in the stove if you have any you might bring them along with you next summer that is if you can find a corner in the plain to carry them I will appreciate them thanks please that is if you have them

P.S. the Indians doing well this year they are getting just a W^m Laett bit of fur its better for fur this year we are all well here at Albany w. L.
