With reference to the light-house reserve, I have to say that this land is not now under the control of this Department. If Mr. Morriveau desires to obtain possession of it, he should apply to the Department of Marine and Fisheries.

Mr. Morriveau's claim might be indicated approximately on the enclosed blue print, and when a surveyor is sent to that locality, the survey will be made in accordance therewith. The blue print is sent herewith in triplicate, in order that one copy may be returned to this Department, and another placed of record in your office, and the third one left with the Indian Agent.

The question as to whether other land is to be obtained in exchange for Morriveau's claim will have to be taken up with the Ontario Government hereafter.
