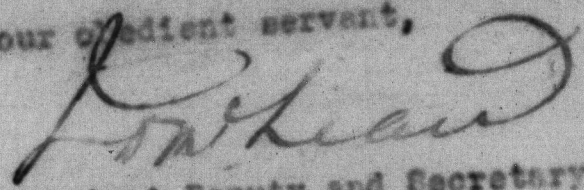
Ottawa, Jan. 9, 1913.

Sir,

It is regretted that it appears to be impossible to arrive at any arrangement or sum to be paid by the Canadian Pacific Railway for the material taken in error at the gravel pit in the Carden River Indian Reserve and for the extra land the railway requires.

There appears to be no other course to pursue than submitting the matter to arbitration in the usual manner. Kindly inform the Indians accordingly and request them to give the name of the gentleman whom they would desire to be appointed as arbitrator in their behalf in this matter.
