Ottawa, Sept. 3, 1913.

Sir,

I beg to say the Department of Indian Affairs requires a survey for one or two drains in the vicinity of Sixty-nine Corners in the Township of Tuscarora, Six Nations Indian Reserve, which work has been entrusted to you if you care to undertake the same. A blue print showing a sketch of the courses of these drains is enclosed. The Eastern main drain with its North and South Branch will probably be about four hundred rods in length. The Western main drain with its East and West branch will probably be about four hundred and fifty rods in length.

Please interview the Indian Superintendent, Major Gordon J. Smith, of Brantford, and also the Indian Chiefs and Council regarding this work.

Please send in a plan and profile together with an assessment in the usual manner. You will obtain duly certified receipts and vouchers for all expenditures and send in your account duly certified in duplicate. You may disregard the partial survey made last year. If you care to undertake this work please notify the Department at your earliest convenience as it is desirable this work should be proceeded with as soon as possible.

Please employ the chief and headmen on this work who may be paid at current rates. Your services will be
