
Ottawa, November 17, 1919

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th ultimo with reference to stationery and office supplies, and in reply to say that:-

1. The inkstand which was received by you in a damaged condition, will be replaced as soon as convenient to have an article of this kind shipped;
2. A requisition for 25 sheets blotting paper was made on the Government Stationery Office on November 3, and on August 26, a perforator and rubber bands were requisitioned for your office. No doubt these articles will reach you in due course.
3. The Department does not, at present, think it necessary to furnish its Indian offices with pencil sharpeners, hand-blotters, desk pads and fancy ink-stands, so that those asked for by you cannot be allowed.
