Q.106 S/Sgt Boyer, will you give the Court a "resume" of your military career, a brief description?

From the time I started joining the Army, Sir? Well, I joined the Army on the 29th September 1939, as a privating the Fusiliers Mont-Royal attached to the QM Stores. They put me in the Quartermaster Stores in the FMR as a Cpl and from there on we moved to Valcartier in early Spring 1940 and then I was promoted to the rank of Sgt. to go to England to take a RQMS course in the Imperial School. I was still RQMS when I came back from overseas and after the battle of France I was decorated by General Montgomery by certificate of duty and then came back from overseas

I had to get 90 days pre-discharge leave and the reason was to make up my mind if I would sign for interim force or go into civil life. I came back in the month of December through New York USA and reported myself to No. 4 Depot in Longueuil where I signed for interim force.
