MR. BOYD'S AMENDMENT.

To Extend the Intercolonial to Winnipeg.

Ottawa, Aug. 29. - The Oppositio have accepted the challenge, and at a late hour last night an amendment to the amendment was moved by Mr. N. Boyd, favoring the extension of the Intercolonial and the placing of its management beyond the influence of

party politics. With this suggestion, that of Mr. Puttee in favor of Government ownership, and the main resolution of Sir Wilfrid Laurier on the Grand Trunk Pacific, the issue will probably reach a division on Tuesday night or Wednesday morning. This position was endorsed by the Liberal members from the Province, Mr. Morrison and Mr. Macpherson. In the debate which occupied the ince, Mr. Morrison and Mr. Macpherson. In the debate which occupied the remainder of the day Mr. T. O. Davis of Saskatchewan strongly endorsed the railway project, and spoke with force of the weaknesses of the C. P. R. agreement made by the Conservative Government. Mr. Davis compared the freight rates on the C. P. R. with those on the Canada Atlantic and those in Iowa, where many of our new settlers are coming from, greatly to the disadvantage of the far-

of our new settlers are coming from, greatly to the disadvantage of the farmers. In fact, said Mr. Davis, the people of the west were farming on shares with the C. P. R. Mr. Robert Holmes also supported the Government's policy. The other speakers of the day were Messrs. Wilmot, Girard, Ward, Richardson, Clare, Archambault, Boyd and Dr. Johnston.

Prof. Wm. Brown's Death.

Australian papers received centain announcements of the death on May 12th last of Prof. Wm. Brown, at his residence in Ascalvale. On going to Australia in 1886, Prof. Brown was appointed to the chair of agriculture in the Dookie Agricultural College, and remained there until his appointment to the college at Longerenony. He was born on April 14th, 1833, at Turriff, Aberdeenshire, Scotland. He received a thorough scientific and practical education, particularly in relation to agriculture and forestry. For some years he was factor to Col. Farquharson, of Invercault, Braennar, but Canada presenting better prospects for his family of three sons and three daughters, he emigrated in 1871, and bought a farm near Orillia, and in addition to farming acted as Provincial Land Surveyer. He was appointed to the charge of the Ontario Agricultural and Experimental Farm in 1875. Prof. Preserved. was appointed to the chair of agri Agricultural and Experimental Farm in 1875. Prof. Brown was author of various important publications in regard to live stock, and was a lecturer of repute. PISCATORY STUPIDITY.

Birds That Exercise Ingenuity. Birds building on high trees are not so wary about the concealing nests as hedge builders and those that seek the springing corn or grass land to the loftiness of situation for secu rity. A nest placed upon the ground is in constant danger of exposure. A browsing animal might destroy it. Then the scythe with one sweep occasionally lays bare one or more nests thereby endangering the eggs or callow nestlings. This renders the parent birds very wary and causes them to practice great ingenuity in their ef-

forts to protect the young birds.

The skylark has been known to carry its egg or offspring to a place of safety after an exposure of the nest, and it has been said its long hind claw—the use of which has puzzled many naturalists—is specially adapted by nature for more easily grasping and transport ing its treasures from the source of danger. When the young birds are too bulky to be thus removed the parent bird carries them on its back though this mode of removal is a somewhat difficult one.—London Tit-Bits.
