T is a solemn thing to have to do with God; and though man has sinned against Him

"The eyes of the Lord are in every place, beholding the evil and the good " (Pro. xv. 3). Said one of old, "Thou God seest me" (Gen. xvi. 13). "Whither shall I flee from Thy presence," spake another (Psalm cxxxix. 9), and again in Heb. iv. 13, we read, "Neither is there any creature that is not manifest in His sight, but all things are naked and opened to the eyes of Him with whom we have to do."
