EARLY AND RARE CANADIAN NEWSPAPERS.

THE EXAMINER, A WEEKLY NEWSPAPER, Its Motto Being "RESPONSIBLE GOVERNMENT AND THE VOLUNTARY PRINCIPLE," about 500 numbers between November, 1844, and August, 1855, *some years being complete*, 25.00.

Commenced in 1838 by MR. (after Sir) FRANCIS HINCKS, immediately after the appointment of LORD DURHAM, about three years after under SIR CHARLES BAGOT, a portion of whose library has been included in our sales for this season. Mr. Hincks was appointed Inspector General, but was defeated at the election under METCALF. He was a warm friend of the devoted W. L. MACKENZIE, whose Son-in-Law, Mr. Charles Lincasay, occupied the editorial chair. In 1850 the editorship was offered to Mr. Mackenzie, who was then in Washington, D.C. We need not say such items as the above abound with the best class of material for the making of history; and for which posterity a hundred years hence will seek in vain.

CHRISTIAN GUARDIAN, A WEEKLY NEWSPAPER, Devoted to Religion, Morality, Literature, Science, Commerce, Agriculture, Domestic Economy and General Intelligence, Egerton Ryerson and James Richardson, Editors, from August 8th, 1832, down to November 6th, 1833, *less two numbers*, also from October 28th, 1843, down to January 17th, 1844, COMPLETE, *this paper was published at York and was first published in 1829*, 10.75 the lot. 2

THE NEWS OF THE WEEK, Toronto, Canada West, from February 10, 1855, to October 13, same year, *less the number for April 7th*. 34 numbers of this 8 page large folio, *some numbers being illustrated with Views*, as THE SHIP CITY OF TORONTO, HOTEL & BATHS, ST. CATHARINES, etc, 6.75 the lot. 3

THE MARKHAM ECONOMIST, A Family Newspaper, especially devoted to the interest of the country, No. 5 and No. 7, to 28, 32 to 52, *the first volume being therefore nearly complete*; July 31, 1856, June 25, 1857; also from No. 1, Vol 3, July 1, 1858, to No. 52; June 23, 1859. *less No. 44, May 5th*, also sixteen numbers of volume 4 same year, *upwards of 100 numbers*, 5.75 the lot. 4
