 “ next, at our said Assembly, you be personally present, with Us and
 “ the Great Men and our Legislative Council aforementioned, upon
 “ the said Affairs to confer, and your Advice to afford. And this as
 “ Us and the Honor, Safety and Defence of our said Province, and
 “ the Church of the same, and the dispatch of the Affairs aforemen-
 “ tioned, You love, you are in no wise to omit. Witness our
 “ Trusty and Wellbeloved ALURED CLARKE, Esquire, Lieutenant
 “ Governor and Commander in Chief of Our said Province of Lower
 “ Canada, at the Castle of Saint Lewis, in Our City of Quebec, the
 “ twenty fourth Day of May, in the Year of Our Lord, One
 “ thousand seven hundred and ninety two, and the Thirty Second
 “ Year of Our Reign.”

The under neath Arrangement, was communicated by His Excel-
 lency the Lieutenant Governor, and the Writs were accordingly
 issued.
