- " An Att for laying an Impost."—And
- " An Ast for appropriating and disposing of the public Monies."

After which His Excellency was pleased to make the following Speech to both Houses.

"Gentlemen of the Council and Gentlemen of the Assembly,

HE Business of the present session being now finish—" ed, it is no longer necessary to detain you from your private affairs, you are sensible, however, that your public duties extend beyond the occasions of meeting in General As
session session from the session of your zeal to contribute during your recess, by every salutary exertion of your influence and authority, to promote and confirm among the people at large, those habits of industry and that spirit of peace and good order, which, under all the difficulties of their situation, have hitherto so remarkably distinguished the inhabitants of this province."

And then the Clerk of the Crown, by His Excellency's comsmand, declared the General Assembly to be prorogued to the sescond Tuesday in June next.
