## Remarkable Runaway In City on Sunday

**Team of Horses Crossed Bridge in a Jump, But Finally Fell Dangling Above River.**

Two horses belonging to Liveryman Brown of Dundas, that at some stage of their life must have been used on horse-cars, got away yesterday for a lively run. The horses, attached to a two-seated surrey, got away from the gents who were driving, in the vicinity of the Clarence St. subway, and after breaking all records for the distance between the subway and Colborne St. Station, started along the tracks; these they kept to in a wonderful manner, crossing the railway bridge over the canal at a fast clip and on top of the falling several times but each time managing to get up and get away again. They reached Lorne Bridge and easily crossed the old span, but when they reached the new G. T. R. span on which the ties are much farther apart, they were caught in the centre, going straight through. Chief Lewis, with three men were called out and, after fastening

a large log along the top railway of the bridge around which a rope was fastened and then fastened around the horses, managed to pull the team up and getting them across alright. The horses were taken to the barns opposite the Kerby, and when seen this morning by The Courier representative, were in a pretty bad condition; their legs and bodies were badly skinned. No bones were broken, however in the mad dash for liberty. Chief Lewis when seen re the runaway, stated it was one of the most peculiar runaways he had ever heard of; he did not see how they could keep to the track so accurately and cross the bridges they did without breaking their legs. The rig was broken up quite badly, but the horses will be back to Dundas this morning.
