ILLOGICAL LIBERALS.

If the British Liberal leaders were to come out squarely in favor of stopping the war, withdrawing the British forces from Boer territory, and restoring the independence of the two sccalled republics, their present attitude would be at least logical and comprebensible, points out the Hamilton Herald. But they do not dare to assume that position. Probably none of them would wish to. They all dedare that the restoration of independence is out of the question. And yet they belabor the government because the government does not end the war by offering the Boers terms of peace which they would accept. It is difficult to see how intelligent statesmen can reconcile such an attitude with the hard facts of the situation.

The Boers have time and again been publicly assured by members of the government that they will be liberally treated when peace is restored-that self-government will be given to them just so soon as it will be safe to do so. The last advances with a view of ending the war were made by Lord Kitchener. The terms he offered were most liberal; but they were rejected by the Boer generals, who declared that no terms short of a restoration of independence would be accepted.

Mr. Kruger says the same thing. Lord Salisbury, with his usual good sense, points out that the Boer leaders can end the war whenever they want to by making peace overtures to the government and accepting reasonable terms which the government would offer. It is now their move. The principal reason why they don't move is, probably, because they regard the British Liberals as their allies, and cherish a lingering hope that these allies can be induced to favor a settlement on the basis of independence.

THRIFT AND MARRIAGE.

A New York clergyman says that the falling off in the number of marriages is owing to the fact that the trusts have produced economical conditions which made it impossible for young men on salaries to keep up with the social march and support wives, comments the Montreal Witness. The standard of living, he points out, is constantly advancing; and becoming more expensive, and young men who are conscientious will not burden themselves with families they may be anable to support. As a consequence the young women have to give up the idea of marrying and turn their attention to trades and professions. The dropping off of the custom of marriage was a complaint as familiar to the ears of the American people before the word Trust was invented, as it is now, The reasons then given for it were those secondar ily referred to above, namely, the higher standard of living, and the increasing prudence which shuns burdens which men do not see their way clear to meet. That the postpone ment, or neglect of marriage is a leading cause of the diminished increase if not absolute decrease of the Anglo-Saxon race in North America, and its recession before other races must be admitted ,and it may be a question whether this conscientious ness and prudence, are as great virtues as men's maiden aunts are apt them into. The customary sneer at young men who marry without the means to support a wife-that is to support a wife in accordance with the prevailing standard of comfortmay have in it a good deal more of the pride of life than of the highest morality. RECIPROCITY WITH CANADA.

The Chicago Herald Record of Thursday discusses the above timely

subject in the following terms: Although it is not generally appreciated Canada ranks third among the customers of the United States. For the year ending June 30th last our exports to our six principal customers were as follows:

For the eleven months of the current calendar year to November 30 the exports to Canada were \$101,768,-306. According to Canadian statistics the imports from the United States are fully \$10,000,000 more annually than they appear in our government reports.

Our largest exports to Canada consist of majufactures of iron and steel. Canada seeks a reduction of our tariff on fish, lumber and coal, all of which we need. Unless we make some reciprocal deal with Canada we are likely to see her free list curtailed at our expense, while the preferential tariff in favor of British goods may be changed so as to put American goods at a prolibitive disadvantage in the Canadian narket. If Congress is wise it will make provision for the negotiation of a reciprocity treaty with Canada before anything intervenes to give our profitable mutual trade a serious selback.
