

## OUR BOYS FOR POLICE.

Baden-Powell Wants Canadians in the South African Constabulary.

Will Likely Enlist at . istrict Head. quarters-The Pay, Terms and Promotion.

Ottawa, Jan. 11 .- The complete arrangements for enlisting and enrolling candidates for the South African con-stabulary will not be effected until the arrival of Capt. Fall, who is now on his way to Canada. The enlistthe arrival of Capt. Fall, who is now on his way to Canada. The enlistment will likely take place at the headquarters of the different military districts of the Dominion. In the West, where, no doubt, a large number of the recruits will come from, there will likely be additional places for enlistment. Among these it is probable that Regina and Calgary will be named in the North-west and Kamlogors and Vancouver, in addition Kamloops and Vancouver, in addition to the headquarters at Victoria, in British Columbia, The major-general is of the opinion that the force will

mobilize at Halifax.

The pay of the officers will be as follows:—Colonel commanding, £1,200 per annum; lieutenant-colonel, £1,000; major, according to importance of station, £750 to £900; captain, according to importance of station, £510 to £600; lieutenants, 23 shillings to 25 shillings are shillings per day; second lieutenants, 20 shillings per day. The travelling allowance is fifteen shillings per day when out of district.

allowance is fifteen shillings per day when out of district.

The term of enlastment will be for three years. The salary of a third-class trooper will be five shillings (a dollar and a quarter) per day. The pay list is as follows:—Superintendent, per day, 15 shillings; staff sergeant, 10 shillings; sergt., 9 shillings; 2nd class sergt., 8 shillings; corporal, 7 shillings and sixtence; first-class trooper, 7 shillings; second-class trooper, 6 shillings; third-class trooper, 5 shillings.

Promotion will be by merit, and commissions will be obtained in the ranks. The age must not be under 20 and not over 35. In addition to salary mentioned, an allowance will be made for extra high market prices to officers and men stationed north of the Vaal River. This is provisionally fixed at two shillings a day. After serving five years and with good char-

fixed at two shillings a day. After serving five years and with good char-acter on retiring, an allowance of one month's pay for every year's service will be given.

## CHINA SIGNS JOINT NOTE.

Now the Real Trouble Among the Powers will Begin.

Paris, Jan. 12 .- As the result of en-

qu'ries in authoritative quarters, the following statement in regard to the Chinese situation is given:— The Chinese plenipotentiaries signed the joint note yesterday, thus con-

cluding the preliminary stage of the negotiations."
It was added that this important step was in ignificant compared with the difficulties to be met with be-tween the powers themselves, whose clashing interest will have full play in the coming discussions. The Unit-ed States' proposals to shift the seat of the negotiations find no favor in the European chancellories. It is considered a great mistake to transfer the negotiations from China where all information is at hand respecting the

situation, and the feeling among the Chinese themselves, and more especially regarding the condition of trade and commerce with which the nego-tiations will be chiefly concerned. The feeling here favors shanghai, if made, as it is pointed out that Shanghai is the most important trade centre in China, and moreover, that the southern viceroys who are favorable to foreigners and anyions to the southern viceroys who are lavor-able to foreigners and anxious to further trade, could make their in-fluence felt. Failing Shanghai, Berlin or Paris are likely to be chosen. The enormous British interests are in fa-vor of the choice of London, but it is improbable that the other powers

will agree to this.

The ministers of the powers will be assisted in the negotiations by com-mercial advisers, while Prince Ching and Li-Hung-Chang will continue to act for the Chinese government. There is no reason to suppose that Russia will withdraw from the joint negotiations. The treaty she has con-cluded with China concerns her special interests in regions contiguous to ber territories, but she has great politi-cal interests to defend and further in the joint conference, which will bristle with obstacles to a speedy settlement.

## LIFE SAVED WITH SALT.

Representative Nevills at Washington was About Gone

When His Prysicians Injected Salt Water Into him and Brought itim Back.

Washington, Jan. 12.—Representative Nevilla, of Nebraska, who has been hovering between life and death for several days, is believed to be out of danger and he owes his recovery to the life-giving qualities of plain salt. On Monday morning Mr. Neville was believed to be dying. His vitality had been practically destroyed by repeated hemorrhages from the lungs. He could not have the lids of his eyes and his pulse beats were hardly perceptible. The physician in attendance, after a consultation with other medical men, decided to try the efficacy of a saline solution consisting of one teaspoonful of common salt diluted in a quart of wafer, injected into the back and breast of the member of congress.

salt diluted in a quart of water, injected into the back and breast of the member of congress.

The first injection was given about noon on Monday and the treatment was continued until a late hour on Tuesday night, when Mr. Neville began to show decided signs of improvement. His delirium ceased altogether on Monday night. On Tuesday forenoon he opened his eyes and late Tuesday afternoon he asked for something to ett. He was given a small quantity to eat. He was given a small quantity of broth. Mr. Neville is apparently so near recovering that the attending physicians are confident that he will be discharged from their care in two weeks and that he will be ready to resume his duties in the house before congress adjourns.

The case is attracting wide attention among Washington physicians and promises to be a cause celegre in medical annals when all the details are known. So far as can be learned Mr. Neville is the first man on the borderland of the next world who has been brought tack to life in Washington by hypodermic injections of salt water.
