Mr D. B. Shaw, of the Willow Vale  
Tannery, is the owner of one of the best  
looking carriage horses in this county.  
Her color is a beautiful blood bay; height,  
15 hands; sound as a dollar, and as kind  
as a pet lamb. "Topsy" can do a mile  
in three minutes, with a week's heading.  
The latest invention in horse shoes is  
the rubber shoe. A deep groove is cut at  
each side along the base, into which rings  
of India rubber are inserted, after the  
horse has been shod. This insures a  
proper foothold and materially lessens  
the concussion. The shoes are also much  
lighter, wear longer, and the nails, being  
under the pads, are prevented from  
working out.
