Lieut. Roper of the 85th Battalion
REPRISES IN GLOWING TERMS TO THE BRAVERY OF CAPT. WEBSTER
The following letter will be read with deep interest as it describes the death in action of one of Wolfville's soldier sons who was greatly esteemed in this community. The letter was received by Mrs. George Webster who is spending the winter in Boston.
Y. M. C. A., France, 12-10-18
DEAR MRS. WEBSTER.—As one of the 219th Battalion officers of the 85th Battalion now with the 85th, I am writing you a line to tell you how we miss your grandson, 28121st. Capt. Webster, C. C., who was killed in action during the great advance of the 30th.
I knew Capt. Webster both in the Battalion and the 219th, of which he was adjutant, and I always looked upon him as a man whom I could trust anywhere.
I was in command of C Coy at the time he was killed and felt keenly his loss. He was an expert in the boys at a war. He read and wrote. No braver or more efficient soldier has ever come under my notice during the two years I have been over on this side of the water. He is buried in a graveyard just outside Cambrai and in due time you will get its location and photographs of his grave. Young Neary has forwarded you his personal belongings.
Permit me to offer you my sincere sympathy and that of every officer, N. C. O. and man in this Battalion. If I can do anything further pray command me.

A King's County Man.
Referring to the election for the second time as mayor of Richmond, England, of Dr. L. G. After graduating from Acadia, the doctor went to McGill University and subsequently took up practice in Sheffield, England, with great success. After taking up his residence in England, Mayor Hunt married Miss Vaughan, of London, and a few years ago retired from active practice, taking up his residence in Richmond. His brothers and sisters in Nova Scotia besides Judge Hunt, are Mrs. S. G. G. wife of Judge Hunt, and Mrs. C. G. G. wife of Dr. G. G. G. The doctor has been much in London for the past three or four years in connection with national committees on which many more new members.

Accidental Shooting.
A shooting accident occurred in Wolfville last Saturday morning, when two boys, sixteen years of age, who are students of the Academy, returned from a hunting trip in the woods near town. One of the young men, in examining the rifle which they had been using and which he believed empty, accidentally exploded a shell, and the owner of the gun, Thurston Syson, of Alberts, received the charge in his shoulder. Medical aid was immediately summoned, and the wound, a severe one, was attended to. Mr. Syson is making good progress toward recovery.
