

THE DOMINION FRANCHISE ACT.

The Revising Officer's Final Court for South Wellington.

THE COURT FOR PULLEN TOWNSHIP.

Judge Drew, the Revising Officer for South Wellington, held his final Court for the revision and amendment of the Voters' List for the Township of Pullen at the Town Hall, Aberfoyle on Thursday, the 24th inst. The Court opened at 9 o'clock in the morning, and sat without any interruption until half-past eight o'clock before the business was finished. Mr. D. Guthrie, Q. 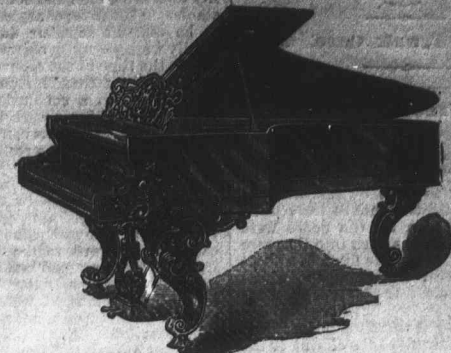
