

ITALIAN'S BULLET AGAIN FINDS VICTIM NEAR PLASTER ROCK

An Englishman Named James Gorman Shot in a Drunken Row on Sunday--Tragedy Occurred in the Vicinity of the Paddy Green Murder--Gorman Shot in Abdomen and Little Hope For His Recovery--Samuel Colle, Who Fired the Fatal Shot, Placed Under Arrest--Claims That He Fired in Self Defence.

From the heart of the fruitful Tobique country, only a few miles from the group of logs behind which Tony Aroscha and Leon Seppell were hiding when they fired the shots which ended the existence of Paddy Green and eventually their own lives, came, last evening, news of another shocking tragedy which will probably mean another murder trial in Victoria county.

Just as the sun had reached the meridian yesterday, a revolver shot rang out at R. H. McDonald's camp on the G. T. P. line, below the Tobique, which meant the fatal wounding of James Gorman, a young Englishman time-keeper at the camp. The shot was fired by Samuel Colle, the Italian foreman of the gang and was the culmination of a drunken row in which the two principal figures in the camp had been involved. The bullet lodged in the abdomen of the injured man and Dr. Coffin and Taylor who attended him held out little hopes of his recovery. Colle was at once disarmed by the other men at the camp and was placed under arrest by Constable Broad, who was called to the camp from Andover, 26 miles away.

Writing to Talk.

The Italian seemed quite willing to talk and admitted the shooting, but claimed it was done in self defence. He was lodged in the jail at Andover, where Aroscha and Seppell spent their last days on earth.

From particulars received last evening it was learned that Colle and Gorman were employed by R. H. McDonald, a concrete contractor on the construction of the Transcontinental. The camp is in the region watered by the Napskeegan, a tributary of the Tobique, and is in direct telephonic communication with the outside world through Plaster Rock. Colle, it seems, was a young Italian who rose above his fellow workmen and was made foreman of the construction crew about a year ago. He spoke English fluently and liked to appear to be as much a native of this country as possible.

Gorman was born in England but is well known at Andover and on the Tobique. He held the comparatively easy position of time-keeper for the crew, but whether there was any jealous rivalry between the two does not appear.

Camp Intoxicated.

The advice received would indicate that the shooting arose from the fact that the whole camp being turned for the day into a carousing hall. Gorman and the prisoner, both inflamed with liquor, came to blows and the Italian having a .22 calibre revolver on his person lost all control of himself and fired the fatal shot. Numbers of men were standing about, nearly all in varying stages of intoxication. What had been a moment before an angry-swooning mob of men, now became a horror-stricken group. Some had presence of mind enough to seize the infuriated foreman and disarm him, but the mischief had already been done. Gorman lay writhing on the floor with the blood pouring from the wound in his abdomen and to all appearances injured beyond recovery.

Mr. McDonald, the contractor, was soon on the spot and took prompt measures for the relief of the injured man and the apprehension of the foreman who fired the fatal shot.

Doctors Called.

Dr. Coffin and Taylor were both called, and after attending to Gorman's injuries, said last evening, that it was hardly possible he would recover. The injured man was married but a few weeks ago, and the murderous bullet of the angry Italian will bring poignant grief to the heart of the young bride.

A telephone message to Andover brought Constable Broad posthaste to the scene of the murder, many miles up the Tobique and by nightfall he had his man lodged safely behind the bars in the substantial jail at Andover.

The constable drove with his prisoner through the valley of the Tobique, and though warned not to say anything that might be used against him, the Italian seemed very willing to talk and continued to speak of the shooting and the events leading up to the tragedy. According to his story he quarrelled with Gorman while both were under the influence of liquor and in the encounter which followed he got very much the worst of the fight. He then resorted to arms and fired the one shot from the revolver which he always carried.

Great Excitement.

The arrival of the constable with the prisoner caused great excitement at Andover. The sickening horror of the Beaver Brook trial and the subsequent trials and executions are still fresh in the minds of the law-abiding citizens, and much feeling is expressed that the fair name of the country should again be stained by a murder trial.

The shooting and Colle's arrest were reported last evening to Attorney General Hazen by T. J. Carter, of Andover, and the latter was instructed to appear for the Crown at the preliminary hearing of the prisoner. Colle will likely be arraigned this morning on the charge of attempted murder, but will be remanded until the outcome of Gorman's injuries can be determined. Magistrate McQuarrie will preside at the preliminary trial. Contract- or McDonald with a number of workmen who witnessed the shooting, will attend the preliminary trial.

No attempt was made to remove Gorman from the camp last night and the latest reports was that he was sinking rapidly.

After a short honeymoon Mr. and Mrs. Christison will return here, where they will reside.
