make war certain. France was defeated, and Napoleon was driven into exile. The ruthlessness of Bismarck when

France was conquered has been told too often to need repetition. To him it was sheer folly to allow a beaten enemy anything more than eyes to weep with.

The Old Pilot There is no space here to refer at length to Bismarck's career from 1870 until the day when the new kaiser (who knew not Joseph) dropped the old pilot. It is sufficient to point out that his policy, both in domestic and foreign affairs, was always contrived with the one end of strengthening the power of the Hohenzollerns and of the Prussian Junkers, who were, and always must have been, their right arm.

When at last he was compelled to hand over the wheel of state to the inexperienced hand of Wilhelm II., not only Germany, but the whole of Europe was practically Prussianized, and nowhere was Prussian influence more dominant than in the British Foreign Office in Downing Street. Bismarck's Germany on Dust-Heap. Bismarck spent the last years of his life giving the game away. His revelations taught the German people that where they had thought they had been the instruments in the hand of God, they had only been the tool of an intriguing minister.
