

Heavy table cloths always last longer than light ones. Never buy a mixture of cotton and linen, and beware of damask that is too stiff, for it has probably been starched to make it appear of better

quality than it really is. Good linen has an elastic texture. Some of the French damasks look all right, but they do not pass the soap-and-water test. Considering all points, Irish linen is far superior to any other.

Two and a half yards is the best width for the ordinary table. Avoid very large table-napkins-no ne likes them. Select a medium sibe, and buy a dozen and a half to go with each cloth. Do not starch your linen
