

EXPLOITS OF THE ZOUAVES.—The Montreal Witness has the following paragraph: The Zouave correspondents at home of the French papers here continue to give interesting narratives of their doings in and around the Eternal City. Not having yet had real enemies to face, which we do not doubt our young countrymen would do in the gallant style characteristic of their race, they show at least that their vigilance cannot easily be found asleep. We are informed that a Canadian sentry, hearing some noise, and not receiving the pass-word or countersign, presented his musket, and after due warning, fired, when great and alarming cries proved that the aim had been good. The soldiers, rising in all haste from their sleep, came to the rescue, and found, after some search in the rocks and branches, a wounded (though not mortally, we are informed)—jackass! Another of our Zouaves, under similar circumstances, killed a goat; and a third fired at a white marble column. The correspondents say that all these acts prove that the Garibaldians would meet with a hot reception. This is probably true; but it is also probable that the Garibaldians would not attack our gallant Zouaves in so mild a manner as did the poor animals and monument storekeepers.

THE FIRST LEOPARD HUNT IN SCOTLAND.—A few days ago five leopards escaped from Manders' menagerie between Lockerbie and Moffat. They dashed into the midst of a flock of sheep but did not injure them. The shepherd took refuge in a tree and when asked by Mr. Manders to come down and help in recapturing the leopard he roared out, "Hoot, awa' mon; ye ken the spotted crayturs; I'll just hide a wee bit here." After great difficulty the leopards were separated from the sheep, and went at a rapid pace towards some outbuildings belonging to Mr. Robertson, when they were after considerable trouble captured. No one was injured, although there can be no doubt that a good few were severely frightened; and well they might be, for as one of the farm servants observed to Mr. Manders (after the capture of the leopards), "Eh mon, and ye ken we pair bodies had ne'er seen sic monster cats; and ye ken the quicker ye gang awa' the safer we'll be."

WHALEN'S TRIAL.—The Ottawa Assizes will open on Wednesday next before Chief Justice Richards, when Whalen will be tried. Mr. O'Farrel, advocate of Quebec, has been in Toronto for several days, and has retained Mr. John Hilliard Cameron, Q. C., Mr. Kenneth McKenzie, Q. C., and Mr. M. C. Cameron, Q. C., to defend Whalen. These learned gentlemen will leave for Ottawa early next week. There are said to be seven Roman Catholics on the petit jury summoned for the Carleton assizes at which Whalen is to be tried. The whole panel numbers fifty-four, of which the Crown may challenge twenty and the prisoner twenty. The witness Lacroix is still retained in goal for safe keeping. It is said the defence will be able to destroy the file of the evidence very materially.

FATAL RAILWAY ACCIDENT AT BRAMPTON.—On Friday an accident occurred at the station in this place, which resulted in the almost instant death of a man named Thomas Moore. Deceased had been standing in a car on a side switch, and jumped off with the intention of crossing the main line. While in the act of doing so he stumbled and was overtaken by the down freight, severely fracturing his skull, and severing one arm completely from the body. Medical skill was of no avail, and in a few minutes he expired. The man was married, leaving a wife and a small family to regret his loss.

Among the plays upon words, letters, and figures which the Presidential contest in the United States is calling out, is the following: if we were to write in a row the letters of the alphabet numbered from 1 to 26, and then add up the figures corresponding to the letters found in the three words, Seymour and Blair, and do likewise with the words Grant and Colfax, the result will be, for Seymour and Blair, 177, for Grant and Colfax, 140. These two amounts together make 317, precisely the number of votes forming the electoral college.

In Elmhurst, there is a church congregation numbering about one hundred, composed entirely of Scottish Highlanders, who speak the old Gaelic tongue in its purity, none of them understanding English to any extent. The London Advertiser notes indications of a brisk fall trade through the western towns. The London Times of the 15th inst., says the crops and the market are nearly as great a paradox as they were thirty years ago. It is agreed on all hands that the wheat harvest is the finest and most abundant ever known, but wheat is jumping up two shillings a week, or more. Straw as a substitute for hay has not been so extensively used in England as in other countries; but the failure of the hay and root crops, in consequence of the excessive and long continued drouth, will necessitate, for the present year, the use of straw for hay. The Canadian Navigation Company have put light draught vessels on the route, in order to allow tourists the pleasure of running the Lechre rapids. The water in some places has been so low as to prevent the large boats of the line running the rapids.
