

SECURITY PROGRESS.—A curious circumstance has occurred in Ecuador, showing how the Jesuits are again gaining ground in South America. This order, it will be remembered, has several times been driven out of all the Spanish American States excepting Ecuador and Guatemala. In those States it has always flourished most, and only suffered once from the Papal edict of Clement XIV., in 1773, which almost annihilated the fraternity. It may be said that Quito is the stronghold of the Jesuits on this continent. Their power is now shown from the news that all the schools in Ecuador have been closed excepting those under Jesuit control. The archbishop and four priests who have opposed the measure have been driven from the country. It is said that the Dictator, Moreno, aims at the Catholic regeneration of Ecuador by putting it entirely under Jesuit rule.
