

The Murder at Newport.
 In our issue of Thursday we gave some particulars regarding a murder said to have been committed at Newport, near Brantford on Monday last. The following further particulars respecting the tragedy are taken from the *Ontario* of Wednesday—
 An inquest was held last evening, at Newport, on the body of David Green, the Indian so foully murdered a short distance from that village on Monday evening. From the evidence it appears that the murdered man, in company with two cousins, had been in Brantford on the day of the murder, going from there to Newport, on the evening proceeded from thence home. On the road home they met a wagon, when Green proposed taking a ride, but as they could not all three ride the cousins advised him to remain with them and walk. This, it seems, he did. The cousins, however, have not since been heard of, nor have the authorities been able to obtain any clue as to their whereabouts. It is said that a dispute was pending between the parties as to the ownership of some land, and which was in possession of the deceased, but that any foul play has resulted out of the dispute in question we can only surmise, as doubtless others will do from the evidence through the examination at the inquest. Nothing was added to prove that any of the parties were the worse of liquor, although they had partaken of less or more while at Newport. The inquest was adjourned for further evidence, of the progress of which we shall keep our readers notified. In the meantime suspicion points strongly to the two cousins as perpetrators of this foul deed, or accessories.

Bread and Molasses.
 The following relating to the Washington Treaty appears in the *Brooklyn Union*:
 "A girl who desperately wanted to get married, but her mother wouldn't let her, found consolation in a slice of bread well served with molasses. The Dominion government strongly remonstrated with the home government because she did not in the Washington Treaty urge damages from the Fenians, and secure commercial advantages as a price for the temporary use of the fishery ground by Americans. For a time Canada refused to be reconciled to the treaty which her mother earnestly sought her to respect, but has finally consented, as the British government has promised her the bread and molasses in the shape of a £2,500,000 loan to construct a Canadian Pacific Railway and the extension of her canal system."

The amount of damages sustained by the *Peruvian* is reported to be much less than at first supposed, and but a small portion of the cargo has been injured. She will be taken to Portland for thorough repairs.


