An Old Landmark Being Demolished

This morning the contractors, who are demolishing the store formerly occupied by Messrs. Smallman & Ingram, took down the old stone at the top of the building, bearing the date 1854.

The structure was one of the oldest in the city, and was known as the Commercial Block.

It was built by Dr. C. G. Moore, father of Dr. C. S. Moore, and a partner named Rolph.

The building was a speculation and at the time it was erected was the largest store building in Western Ontario.

Dr. C. S. Moore stated to The Advertiser this afternoon that the building was too large for the London of those

days, and as an investment was a decided failure.

Mr. J. B. Smallman informed a reporter this afternoon that the building will be level with the street next week, and that work on the new steel and concrete structure that is to replace it will be begun at once.

The steel for the new building is practically all in the city now, having been coming in carloads for many days.

The walls and roof of the new building will be built as soon as possible, and it is expected that all will be finished before snow falls, that the work of finishing the interior may be proceeded with during the winter months.

A New York firm is doing the work.

Septic Tanks Are Not Yet in Use

The septic tanks which have been constructed for about three or four months have not yet been used.

At present all the city sewage is dumped into the river after having passed through the old sewage beds at the city farm.

This does not make for better sanitary conditions in the city. The septic tanks were constructed for the

purpose of purifying the sewage that would be dumped into the river, by removing all the animal impurities.

"The septic tanks have not been inspected by the board of works," said City Engineer Graydon, "when they are inspected they will be put in operation. I do not know when that will be."

The tanks cost about \$12,000.

Maud Mule Resented Attentions

As a result of coming in contact with the hind portion of a male's hoof, Whitney Buller, an employee of the London Electric Power house, is now nursing a badly damaged right arm which, although badly bruised and swollen, is not broken so far as can yet be determined.

Mr. Buller resides in West London with a family named Letich, and yesterday went out to feed a mule,

which, by the way, is named Maud. "I saw Mr. Buller coming and welcomed him with a loud 'Hee haw!'" Mr. Buller was so pleased with his welcome that he entered the stall and slapped Maud on the side. Maud apparently did not relish such familiarity and responded by kicking her hind legs in the air. In consequence, the London Electric will pay a mule employee for some time.

Robert Egerton Dead.

The death occurred this morning of Mr. Robert Egerton, of 524 Hill street, one of London's best-known painters. Mr. Egerton was 64 years old and had only been ill a short time. He came to this city from England many years

ago. The funeral will be held Saturday afternoon to Mount Pleasant Cemetery.

Local Man Viciously Assaulted Pool Room Employee Found Guilty

Joseph Wilson's Head Smashed by Mr. P.—Oh, Name Is Too Long.

In the police court this morning, Theodore Pappinacaleu, the only man, as far as is known, who ever appeared in a London court that has all the vowels in his name, was found guilty of assaulting and wounding Joseph Wilson.

Wilson was in a local pool room yesterday when he was ordered to get off a pool table by the gentleman with the lengthy name, who is a collector in the pool room.

Wilson got off, and Mr. P. threatened to kill him, it is alleged, and came at him and hit him three times, the last blow striking Wilson on the head and causing such injury that medical attention was required.

After hearing the evidence, Pappinacaleu was hauled in the sum of \$100 to appear for sentence in a week.

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May Be Brother of Joseph Robson

A dispatch to The Advertiser states that Joseph Robson, of London, was killed at Barrington, Illinois, yesterday by being run over by a train.

Mr. William Robson, the well-known produce dealer in the Market Lane, stated to The Advertiser this afternoon that he had a brother, Joseph Robson, who was a sailor, and who was in the United States.

It is some time since Mr. Robson has heard from his brother, and he is inclined to think that the man who is killed may be him.

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
