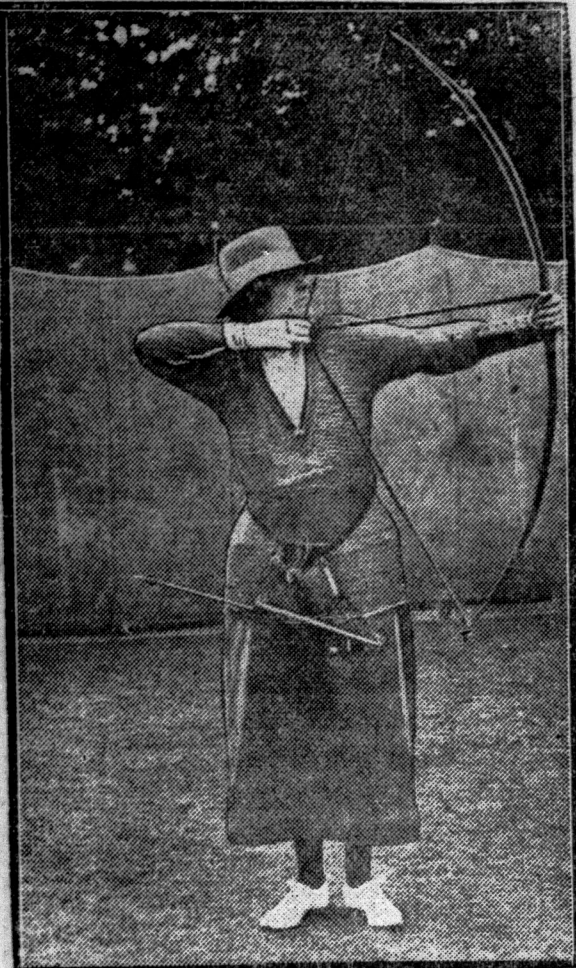
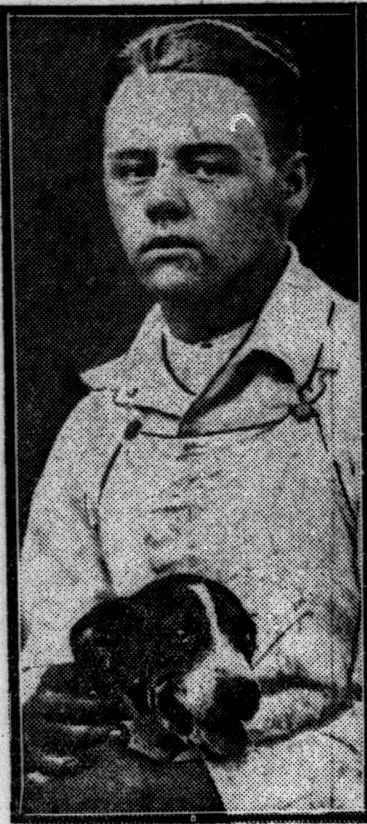

Jesse M. Collinson, who hasn't smiled for so long that his neighbors have offered a reward of \$10 for anyone who can change his lugubrious expression.



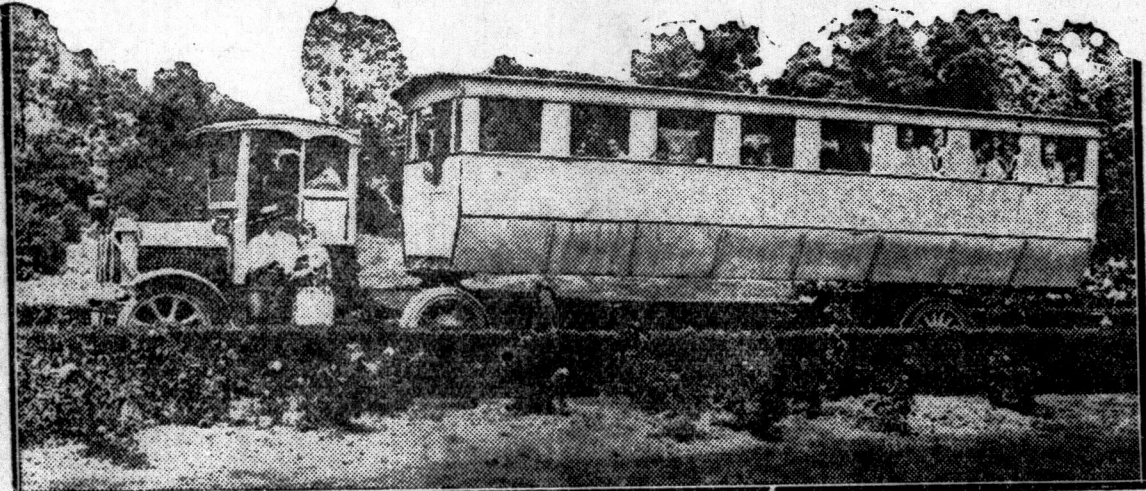
The winner of the "driving the nail" contest at a picnic of the Independent Order of Foresters completed the operation with six blows.



Evelyn Gordon, a well-known Chicago actress, has recently returned from an engagement abroad.



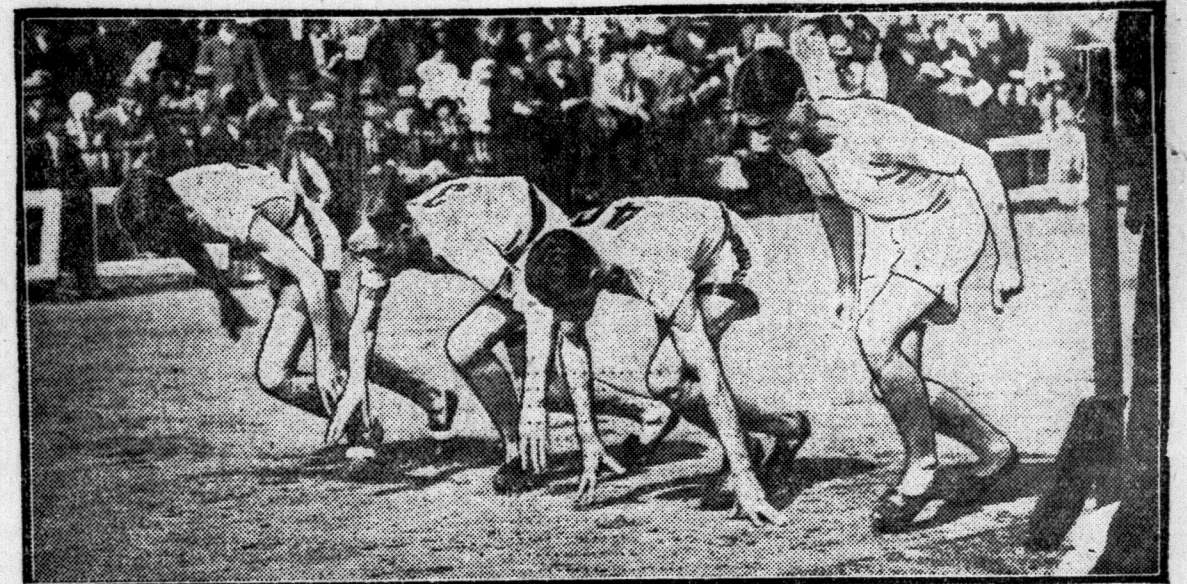
He fell in love with her feet. She is Margaret Young, the Metropolitan Opera soprano, whose recent barefoot golf won for her a husband.

The start of the half mile race when America and England competed in a recent athletic meet.



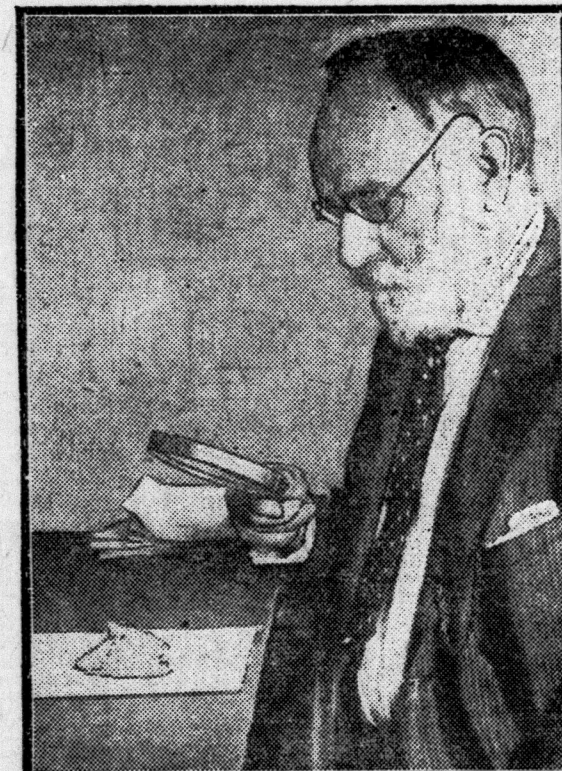
Photo shows Lady Sybil Graham, the wife of the Hon. W. R. Graham, British ambassador to Italy.

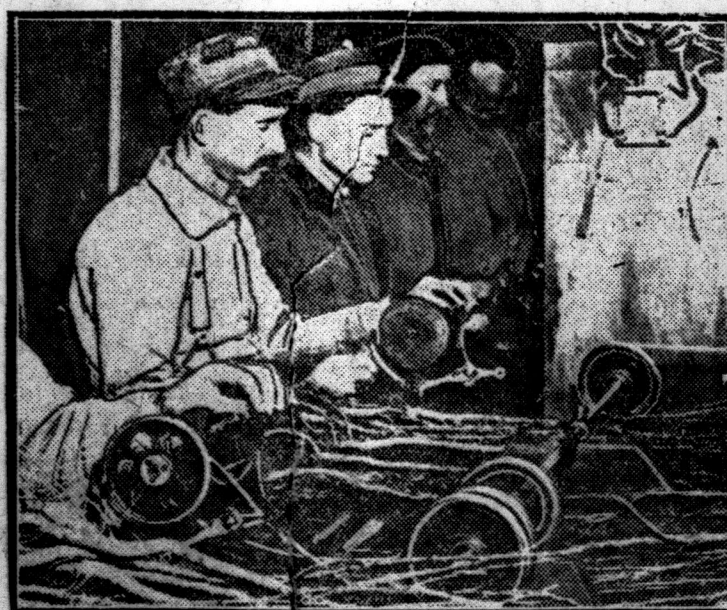
The Duke of York is quite alert waiting to return a service in the R. A. F. doubles tennis championship in which he figured recently.



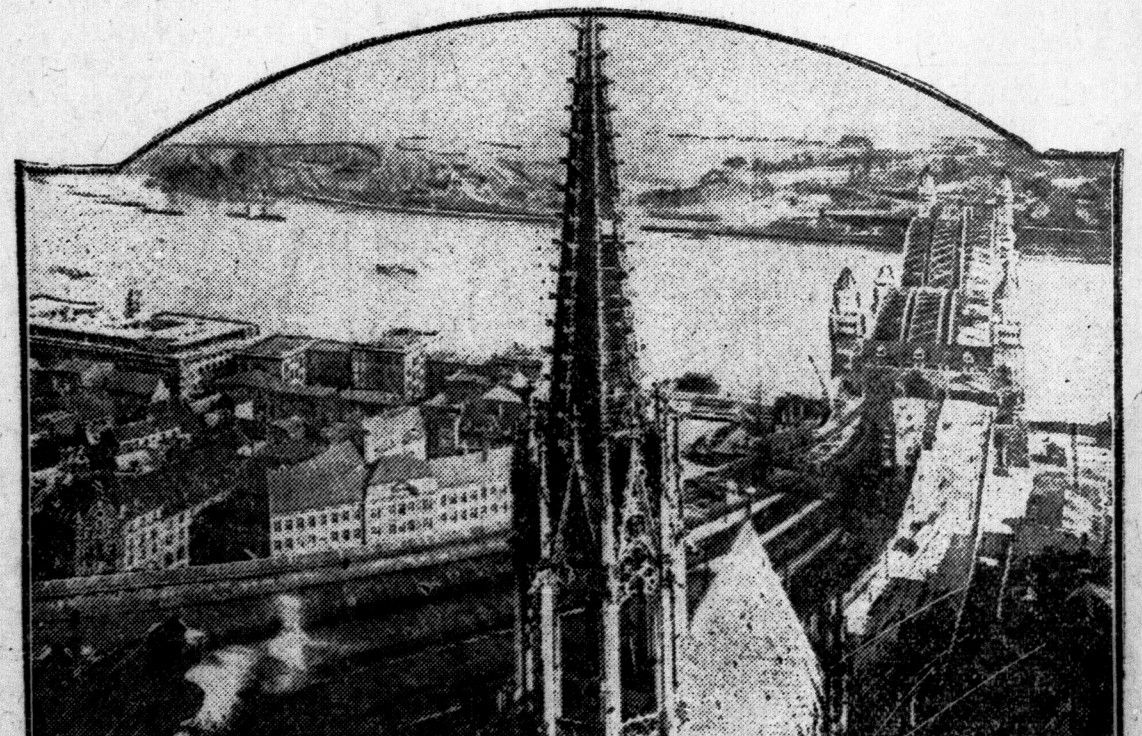
This Belgian police dog can't complain that he is living a "dog's life."
