### Here and There

The popularity of the Nova Scotia apple is rapidly growing in Europe. 1,103,980 barrels and 8,693 boxes were shipped in 1924-25 to ports in England, Scotland and Germany. Shipments also went to Newfoundland, West Indies, Central Canada and the United States.

Production of sugar beets in Canada during 1923 amounted to 159,200 tons, valued at \$1,922,668, and grown on 7,941 acres, according to the Bureau of Statistics. 6,000 acres have been planted to beets this year in Southern Alberta, due to the establishment of a sugar beet factory.

Milton Sills, the well-known movie actor, with a company of 32 other screen artists, passed through Montreal recently to take scenes in "The Come Back" in which he is featured. The party went to Beauchemin, in Northern Quebec. Travelling by another train was a mother skunk and five kitten skunks which will also figure in the picture.

The 286 passengers on the Canadian Pacific S.S. Empress of France completed their 30,000-mile tour of the world on Saturday, May 23, when the vessel docked at New York. At their last stop at Havana, President Machado of Cuba invited the passengers to attend his official inauguration and to witness the unveiling of a statue to the preceding President.

Another aristocratic rancher recently passed through Montreal on a return visit to the ancestral estates in Transylvania, Hungary. This was Baron Josef Cavosky who, with his brother Andre, took over a 1,600-acre ranch last March near Cochrane, Alberta, on the Bow River. Incidentally the Baron was a passenger on the Trans-Canada on its first return trip of the season from Vancouver.

The Indian Day Celebration at Banff, it is announced, will take place as usual this year on the third Thursday and Friday in July. Preparations are already under way for this event, which enjoys an enviable reputation as an Indian show. The Stoney Indians arrive in large numbers from their reservation to take part in the ceremonies, which are the 23rd annual celebration of the festival.

During the sixteenth century the custom prevailed all over England of celebrating a flower dance early in May. This was undoubtedly a relic of the Roman Floralia, or Floral Games, which began at the end of April and lasted for seven days.

### Here and There

Since the first of April up to the present time approximately seven million pounds of various fish have been landed at North Sydney, N.S., by local fishermen. The catch made so far this season is far in excess of any previous year's catch in the history of this port.

All tourist and motorist records are being broken at Banff this year. There are three times as many campers as in any other year and 2,400 more bathers than in 1924. The Canadian Pacific hotel here and at Lake Louise reports bookings as being unusually heavy.

More Alberta provincial savings certificates were sold in the first six months of this year than in any full year previously, even including the big record year of 1920. Since the beginning of the current year up to the end of June, the total sales amounted to \$1,911,600. There is now close to \$7,000,000 outstanding in savings certificates.

Radio receiving licenses held in Canada at the end of last month numbered 56,063, according to a statement issued by the Federal Government. Ontario leads all provinces with a total of 26,507 Quebec occupied second place with 7,882 licenses, followed by Saskatchewan with 6,551; Manitoba, 4,443; British Columbia, 3,392; Alberta, 3,004; Nova Scotia, 1,435; New Brunswick, 736; Prince Edward Island, 87; Yukon, 22; and Northwest Territories, 5.

A consignment of 21 fox hounds from the famous Mendip Hunt Pack, in Somerset, England, was brought to Canada early in August by the Dominion Express Company for the Toronto Hunt Club. The English papers published photographs of these splendid animals and expressed gratification that good British hounds were being used on the hunting fields of Ontario. This is the third such consignment brought out by the Dominion Express within recent weeks.

The delegates to the Empire Press Conference at Australia who came from Britain and passed through Canada recently spent several days in the Canadian Pacific Rockies and enjoyed themselves trail-riding and hiking among the beauty spots that surround Banff and Lake Louise. Lord Burnham and several other distinguished British journalists established new walking records in covering the distance between Wapta and Emerald Lake in two hours, while it took the trail riders on ponies two hours and a quarter to cover the same ground.

### NO CHILDREN UNDER FOURTEEN

### Years To Be Allowed On Streets After Nine O'clock.

At the council meeting held on Friday night the long-discussed Curfew By-Law was passed. From now on children under the age of fourteen will not be allowed the freedom of the streets after nine o'clock at night, unless accompanied by an adult. A copy of the curfew regulation which also provides for a fine in case of offence, follows:

Be it enacted by the Town Council of the Town of Campbellton as follows:

1. No child under the age of fourteen years shall be allowed upon any public street, park or any other public place within the Town of Campbellton after the hour of nine o'clock in the evening of any day unless accompanied by an adult person in charge of such child.

2. Every parent, guardian or person with whom any child under the age of fourteen years may reside, who shall allow or permit any such child to be upon any public street, park or other public place within the Town of Campbellton on any day after the hour mentioned in the preceding section and unaccompanied by an adult person, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-Law and liable on conviction thereof to a penalty, not exceeding Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each and every such offence, to be recovered with costs in any court of competent jurisdiction.
