Fort Saskatchewan has a wire rope factory. The fare per stage from Calgary to Edmonton is \$25. It takes from Monday to Friday to make the trip.

Ontarians are taking the place of cards with the young men of Edmonton. On Sept. 31, small groups of young men and women in the gardens of Edmonton were seen and grown.

Extensive repairs were being made at Edmonton about Sunday. There is only one brick building in Edmonton—the Jasper house.

Calgary is to have a weekly paper the same size as the Bulletin. It will be published at 17c. per head at Edmonton.

At Calgary, Winnipeg XXXX flour sells at \$3.50 per 100 lbs. lower when bought in quantities.

Beef cattle are worth \$30 per head and are not plentiful. Stock prices are worth from \$35 to \$40.

Calgary is anxiously awaiting the opening of a postoffice and a weekly mail to Edmonton.

Two hundred and forty tents, big and little, are pitched within sight of each other at Calgary. They are occupied by soldiers and boarding houses.

The passenger train from Calgary to Winnipeg is \$37.75 divided as follows: Calgary to Medicine Hat 12c. per mile, Medicine Hat to Swift Current 40c. per mile, and Swift Current to Winnipeg 30c. per mile.

The Canada Pacific railway has a uniform rate of 3c. per mile.

Edmontonites are rejoicing because coal has been reduced to \$1.50 per gallon.

On Aug. 29, 1888, the Rev. Father Scott arrived home after an absence of eleven months, most of which time he spent in the West.
