MINING IN BRITISH COLUMBIA.

interprising Operator Return Montreal Tells of the Latest

Montreal Tells of the Latest

Bovelopments.

Montreal, Oct. 14. — Capt. Adams, who is largely interested in the mining development of British Columbia, arrived home from the coast yesterday, and gave some interesting details regarding the situation in that province. He says that a great deal of work has been done in the sonthern part of the province this summer, and the country all along the boundary line for 300 miles appears to be rich in silver, copper and gold, more development work being done this season than ever before. In the Kootenay District a great advance has also been made—the Pilot Bay smelter was completed in the spring, builton is being shipped out regularly, and the Canadiah Pacific and the Kaslo and Slocan, which connects with the Great Northern, are now into the very heart of the Slocan district. Capt. Adams says that there is a concentrator at Three Forks, and another being built at Sandon for the Slocan Star mine, which is said to have \$3,500,000 worth of silver ore in sight.

have \$3,500,000 worth of silver ore in sight.

"What have you done on your own account?" asked The World.

"I have opened a property there called the Mt. Adams silver mine, and an expert from the University of Chicago declares it to be one of the greatest extents of surface-showing ore ever discovered. Tramways now run up the mountain connecting with the Almo mines, and the Canadian Pacific, running to the concentrator at Three Forks, has opened up to civilization and industry what was an impenetrable forest three years ago. The mining men now say that the Slocan district is the greatest silver region in the world, owing to the large extent and high grade of the ore, and even at the present price of silver the mines will pay better than almost any of the gold-bearing districts."

Continuing, Mr. Adams stated that the great excitement of the year centres round-Trail Creek, on the Columbia River. The town of Rossland, which last fall had 60 people, now possesses a population of 3000, and town lots are selling at \$1500.

"Rossland is seven miles from the Columbia, and the Canadian Pacific are building a branch to the town. 
