

Washington, Dec. 20.-In the Senate to-day Mr. Morgan brought up the bill for the Venezuela Commission. He said the Foreign Relations Committee had some amendments to offer. al-though he was in favor of passing the bill as it came from the House.

There was no need of talking about a probable war, although the American people would not shun it if it was forced upon them.

Mr. Sherman (Rep., O.), said he could not for the lif eof him see the necessity of haste. Congress had already endorsed the President in his declaration of the Monroe edict. England was not engaged in a fresh aggression; on the contrary she was taking very serious consideration of the whole subject; she needed no excitement to cause her to heed the spirit that prevailed here. Mr. Sherman said he had no doubt but that the trouble would be settled by an amicable agreement between Great Britain and Venezuela; he had no idea there would be a drop of American blood spilt over this mainter.
