PANAMA CANAL LOCKS. Plenty of Leeway For the Largest Ocean Steam We were shown in the central offices

at Culebra a most interesting model of a typical completed lock with a small wooden replica of the Olympic going through it. The Olympic is one of the new Titans of the White Star line, 890 feet in length and 92 feet wide, and she will have plenty of leeway in a chamber whose usable dimensions are 1,000 by 110 feet. The Olympic with her 50,000 gross and 45,-900 net tonnage represents the largest type of vessel that can seek to cross the isthmus for a long time to cross isthmus for a long time to come, and there is still a margin left for ships even more monstrous. The average vessel will take from ten to twelve hours to cross the isthmus, and there is no reason why passengers should not proceed by train if they like in advance of the ships and disport themselves as they please at either terminus. 


