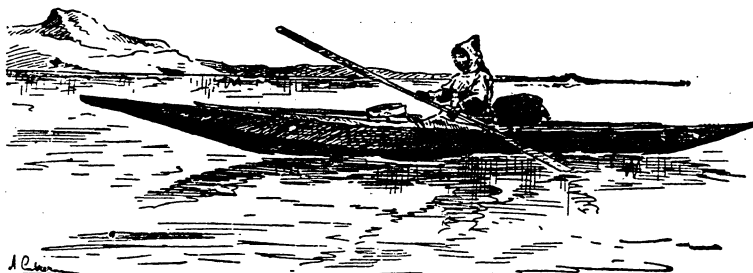


ESQUIMAU DOG-WHIPS.
