ON the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Customs, and under authority given by the Act 3ist Vic. Cap. 6, intituled: "An Act respecting the Customs;" His Excelency has been pleased to make the following Regulation:

On, from and after the first day of March, proxi mo, the Port of Queenston in the Province of Ontario, shall be and is hereby discontinued as an independent Port of Entry, and shall be and is hereby constituted an Out Port of Entry, and placed under the Survey of the Port of Niagara.
