

# Synopsistof Coal Mines Regulations.

OAL mining rights of the Dommion, in Manitoba, Saskatchewan-and in a portion of the province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years renewal for a further term of 21 years at an annual retail of 81 an acre. Not more than 2560 acres will be leased in one again and leased to one applicant.

Application for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent o' the district in which the rights applied

A royally shall be paid on the merchantable autput of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the Agent with sworn selarns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal miner and pay, the royalty thereon. If the ceal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year. The least will include the coal mining rights only, rescinded by Chap, 27 of 4.5 George V, assented to 12th June, 1914.
