Fifthly the castings are strong and smooth. Sixthly, they are very straight and not warped. The Company has expended a large amount of money in getting the works in first class condition. Mr.

Bailey has done his part to the satisfaction of all parties. His selection of the various brands of iron has been good, and in every respect he has shown his thorough knowledge of the business.

The Company will not only make agricultural machinery castings, but will give special attention to saddlery and carriage hardware, builder's hardware, and castings of all kinds for various branches of manufacture in Canada. We are informed that the works will be enlarged as soon as the weather will permit, by the erection of additional moulding shops and annealing ovens so as to meet the demand for high grade goods. It is not the intention of the Company to make the lowest priced castings, but the best which have ever been made in Canada, and everything that labor, skill, money and care can do, will be done to maintain the quality of the goods turned out. It is a most important industry to Oshawa, as it will employ a large number of skilled workmen who are able to earn high wages, and must attract other business to the town.
