The Regular Session begins on the third Tuesday of September, 1896, and continues six months. During this session, in addition to four didactic lectures, two or three hours are daily allotted to clinical instruction. Attendance upon four regular courses of lectures is requisite for graduation. A four years' graded course is provided. Four years' required from Oct., 1896. The Spring Session embraces recitations, clinical lectures and exercises, and didactic lectures on special subjects. This Session begins the Second Tuesday in April, 1897, and continues ten weeks.

The laboratories are open during the Collegiate year for instruction in Chemistry, Microscopy, practical demonstrations in Medical and Surgical Pathology, and lessons in Normal Histology. Special importance attaches to "the superior clinical advantages possessed by this College."
