REPORT ON ATTENDANCE OF INDIANS

Mr. Judd Buchanan (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development): Mr. Speaker, the hon. member for Skeena asked for this report during the past session. It was stated in the reply that since the writer had specifically requested that the confidentiality of the report be respected, the report should not be tabled. The government's stand on this matter has not changed since to permit the tabling of this report. I would therefore ask the hon. member to withdraw his motion.

Mr. Howard (Skeena): The writer of the report was paid by the government to do public relations work for the department. I think the question should be put.

Mr. Speaker: Is the motion transferred for debate?
