who desires to be unknown, by the Hands of the Lord Bishop of Bangor. Also a Benefaction of Twenty-seven Shillings, by the Rev. Dr. Slow-cock, from a Person who desires to be unknown. Also a Benefaction of Five Guineas, paid out of the Estate of Mr. Barnabas Oley, deceas'd, and remitted by the Mr. Archdeacon Knight. Also a Benefaction of Six Pounds Sixteen Shillings and Six Pence, collected from some of the Clergy of the Diocese of Carlisse, and remitted by the Reverend Dr. Waugh, Chancellor of Carlisse.

For all which Benefactions the Society have returned their Thanks by the Perfons who reported or paid them, except those where the Benefactors have thought proper to conceal their Names, who are hereby desired to accept of the Thanks of the Society.

The Society direct their Missionaries to send them constantly, an Account of the Progress they make in their Missions; and they have received in this last Year, the following Accounts.

The Reverend Mr. Killpatrick, Mission of at Trinity-Bay, in Newfoundland, hath been obliged to come to England for a little Time, he brought with him a Letter to the Society, dated the 17th of November, 1737, Trinity, in Newfoundland, figned Jacob Taverner, and Thomas Floyd, wherein they in the Names of the Justices of the Peace, Church-Wardens, and Inhabitants of Trinity-Bay, do gratefully thank the Society for sending them a Missionary.
