

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

SAINT ANDREW'S SOCIETY OF QUEBEC.

ARTICLE I.

OF THE NAME AND SEAL OF THE SOCIETY.

The Society shall be named "THE ST. ANDREW'S SOCIETY OF QUEBEC," and shall have a common Seal, with its name engraved thereon, around the Arms of Scotland, with the National Motto, "*Nemo me impune lacesset.*"

ARTICLE II.

OBJECTS OF THE SOCIETY.

The Society is instituted for the purpose of affording relief and advice to natives of Scotland and their descendants who may stand in need thereof, and with the view of promoting union among all classes of Scotchmen and those of Scotch origin in Canada.

ARTICLE III.

OF RESIDENT MEMBERS.

None but Scotchmen, and the children, grand-children, and great-grand-children of natives of Scotland, or sons of Members, shall be admitted as Resident Members of the Society. When any person is to be proposed for admission
