TURKISH ATTACKS LESSEN IN VIGOR

Situation Favorable to Allies, But Progress is Necessarily Slow.

PROGRESS OF NIBBLING

Official Statement Says Trench Warfare is Getting Results.

LONDON, June 15.—The following announcement concerning operations at the Dardanelles was given out here officially today: "The situation on the Gallipoli Peninsula has developed into trench warfare. After our success on the 4th inst the Turks have evinced a great respect for our offensive, and by day and night they have to submit to captures of trenches."

"On the morning of the 13th a counter-attack was made by the Turks, who rushed forward with bombs but coming under the fire of the naval machine gun squadron were annihilated. Of the fifty who attacked, thirty dead bodies were counted in front of that part of our trenches."

"The situation is favorable to our troops, but is necessarily slow on account of the difficulties of the ground. The Turkish offensive has sensibly weakened."

GERMANS CROSSED LOWER SAN RIVER

Enemy Also Forced Passage of Lubaczowka and Captured Village.

FIGHT ON WIDE FRONT

Russians Stop Offensive of Kaiser's Forces in North and Central Poland.

LONDON, June 15.—The Germans have crossed the lower San River and the Lubaczowka, a tributary, after stubborn engagements with the Russians throughout Saturday and Sunday, says the Russian official report received last night.

Dispositions are being made to deal with this new offensive. Several companies of Tyrol riflemen were sent to the front to meet the Russian bridgehead near Nizowka Village in Galicia Sunday night. The enemy had made some headway when the Russian counter-attack was an audacious counter-attack. Russian territorialists also distinguished themselves in counter-attacks on the Germans at the town of Stryk, a region of the Dniester, gathering in as prisoners eight officers and 400 men.

The enemy has made no headway in the offensive that he began in northern Poland. At Shavli, in the Baltic provinces, the battle is progressing. The town of Shavli has been bombarded by heavy artillery.

BRITISH NAVAL LOSSES DURING TEN MONTHS

LONDON, June 15.—In all 13,547 officers of the British navy, including marines and men and boys of the naval division, have been killed or wounded or reported missing from the beginning of the war up to May 31, according to announcement made in the House today. Of this total 3,245 were killed.

PENSION FUND MAY BE INVESTIGATED

Alleged That Changes Were Made to Benefit Certain Persons.

WANT BUS FRANCHISE

Company Prepared to Spend Large Sum on Big Jitneys.

The action of council on Monday in approving the payment of pensions from the firm's benefit fund to ex-Chief Thompson and ex-Deputy Chief Noble, may result in the affairs of the fund being judicially investigated.

James W. Bain and A. D. McBride yesterday asked the board of control for a permit to operate a bus system on some of the city's busiest streets. A permit extending over a number of months is asked for and the gentlemen interested say they are prepared to spend \$200,000 and put 60 buses into service, having a capacity of from 20 to 30 passengers. It is practically a franchise that the deputations asked for, and while the policy of the board is to allow anyone to run buses so long as they comply with the by-law, no guarantee as to the length of time they may operate will be given.

Will Investigate. A special meeting of the civic parks committee was held yesterday afternoon to discuss the action of the board of education in regard to Jesse Ketchum Park and school grounds. Some years ago it was arranged that the city should have part of the school grounds for athletic purposes and part of the park land was given in exchange for school purposes.

Dr. J. B. Fraser was at the board of control again yesterday, urging that the use of fresh unpasteurized milk be allowed. He came accompanied by a deputation of doctors and nurses, and had a petition signed by about eighty medical men asking that the privilege be given. One doctor pointed out that pasteurized milk was unsuited for some babies and that certified milk was out of the question on account of the price.

The assessment on the land in West Toronto owned by Ald. Rydman stands at \$200. The city treasurer, Mr. Rydman, is therefore introduced not with the object of inducing travelers to spend more money, but to spend less, the object being to reduce the assessment and not to dispend travelers.
