CRICKET IN ENGLAND FIXTURES NEXT SEASON

Series of Test Trial Matches— Mixed Team From India to Visit Old Country.

London Sporting Life: The dawn of the cricket year comes with the meeting of the first-class secretaries at Lord's. It is true that practically all the fixtures are nowadays arranged previously by correspondence, and the gathering of well-known figures—looking strangely unfamiliar in midwinter mud—in the warm, long room of the pavilion, no longer entails the hours of strenuous labor to make order out of chaos, so common a few years ago, but the meeting does the actual marking of the season's course, the official pronouncement of the good things to come.

Mr. Lacey, secretary M. C. C., opened the meeting with a brief speech. As they knew, he said, it had been decided to play a series of test trial matches in 1911, the grounds and dates of which would be: Sheffield—June 2, 3, and 4 (Probables v. Possibles);

Lord's—June 23, 24, and 25 (Probables v. Possibles);

Old Trafford—Aug. 23, 24, and 25 (Probables v. Possibles);

Lord's—July 10, 11 and 12 (Gentlemen v. Players);

Old Trafford—Aug. 23, 24, and 25 (Probables v. Possibles);

Those counties which had occurred in the test trial arrangements, Mr. Lacey continued, would have the net profits of the matches to the following extent: Twenty per cent. would go to clubs upon whose grounds the matches were played; instead of thirty per cent., which applied under the test match arrangement; five per cent. instead of ten per cent., would go to the minor counties; and twenty-five per cent. instead of sixty per cent., would be divided equally among the first-class counties and the M. C. C. The original arrangements that had been made for test matches, however, would remain in force.

Turning to the tour of the Indian team in England next season, Mr. Lacey said he had been authorized by the M. C. C. committee to arrange the program, and he should very much like to thank those counties and clubs that had enabled him to make the list of fixtures attractive. He also wished to thank those who had offered guarantees. The Indians were not coming to England with any desire to make money, but very naturally they wanted, if possible, to defray their expenses. Their chief object was to play their cricket, and that could best be done by playing the leading clubs and by meeting first-class players. In connection with the tour, it was a significant fact that this was the first time that Mohammedans, Parsis and Hindus had combined to send a team to England.

Last season the M. C. C. sent a side to Belgium, and next season they had been invited to send sides to Denmark, Holland and Germany, and we might say without exaggeration that cricket exercised a strong, silent force in establishing friendly relations with foreign and distant countries. He was anxious that the Indian tour in England should be a success, and he asked them confidently to help him as much as possible to that end.

Except for the visit of the Indian team, which, although of much interest, cannot, of course, be considered in the same light as a visit of the Australians or the South Africans—next season, like last season, will be of a purely domestic character. In the majority of cases the programs of the counties differ little from those of a year ago. Surrey and Lancashire are again the only clubs who will play out-and-home matches with all the remaining

counties, but the only absentee from Yorkshire's list is Gloucestershire. Kent and Nottingham have patched up their differences, and will meet for the first time since 1906, and the only sides not met by Kent will be Derbyshire and Warwickshire. Hants renew their fixture with Leicestershire and drop Northamptonshire. Middlesex repeat their program of 1909, and Nottingham repeat theirs of 1908, to make room for Kent. Sussex increase their program by including Northamptonshire. Worcestershire have new engagements with Leicestershire, who, with Hampshire returning to their card, play eleven out and home games, against last year's nine. Warwickshire's program is limited to ten out-and-home championship games, while the counties met by Northamptonshire have fallen to nine. Derbyshire have lost Kent, and Somerset and Gloucestershire make no changes.
