A NY person who is the sole head family, or any male over 18 oid, may homestead a quarter secti available Dominion land in Man Sasitatchewan or Alberta. The appl Sasisatchewan or Alberts. The applicast nust appear in person at the Dominou Lands Ageney or Sub-agency for the dis-trict. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother er sister of intending homesteader. Dutes.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within it i miles of his homestead on a farm ef at least 80 acres, solely owned and occu-pied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.
