LARGER ONTARIO ACREAGE FOR PLOW

Increased Area of Fall Wheat Will Likely Be Sown This Year.

The following is a summary of reports made by agricultural representatives to the Ontario department of agriculture:

Fall plowing is being pushed along vigorously and a larger acreage than usual will probably be turned under. Many farmers are using tractors. The land has worked well as a result of the recent rains. An increased area of fall wheat will likely be sown this year. Some has been got in already. Some fields of late oats still re-

main to be cut. Some of this crop has required the mower, owing to the short straw.

The threshing of spring grains is proceeding actively, but in many cases the result is disappointing to expectations.

Potatoes so far dug have given comparatively light yields taking the province over. The rains of the last two or three weeks, however, have done good to the late varieties. Roots also are picking up well from the same cause.

Corn Revives With Rain. Corn has revived with the rains, but is more or less uneven, crop returns varying greatly as to its condition. On the whole, however, it will approach a fair general yield. The wonderful improvement of pastures during the last two weeks has been most encouraging to owners of cattle, some of whom were letting their feeders go to market owing to poor grass and the light yields of spring grains. The decrease in the yield of milk has been stayed, and in many instances the flow has been improved. Feol states that alike has yielded

well, and that some farmers have sold their seed at \$25 a bushel. Duffert reports that the threshing of sweet clover for seed has turned out satisfactorily.

Live stock are in normal condition with comparatively light marketing. Grenville states that a large number of helters are being shipped from Brockville to the United States, to be reshipped to Belgium.

Peaches, which are light in yield this season owing to the heavy August drop, will be marketed a week or two earlier than usual. Lincoln states that grapes are selling at from \$50 to \$75 a ton, and plums at \$ 1-2 cents a pound. Huron reports large shipments of plums from that county during the week.

FREE AS BIRDS

Interviewed yesterday in reference to the authority of aviators to take on passengers, Chief of Police Grasett said the flying men are as free as the birds. There is no law governing aviators here and passengers go up at their own risk.

SOLDIER-TEACHERS ARE REINSTATED

Will Become Principals of Lansdowne and Wilkinson Schools.

At a meeting of the school management committee yesterday afternoon, at the board of education, administration building, certain recommendations made in June, regarding transfers of teachers and the reinstatement of soldier teachers, were carried out. Percy G. Micht and D. M. Davidson, two returned men, were reinstated to the staff and assigned to the principalships of Lansdowne and Wilkinson Schools, respectively. A. W. R. Doan, acting principal of

Byerson School, was transferred to the position of principal of Queen Victoria School. A. C. Dodds, principal of Wilkinson School, was transferred to succeed W. D. Hannah, principal of Victoria Street School, who has been assigned to the principalship of Wellesley School.

The committee sat for some time and cleaned up a lot of business in connection with leave and appointments of teachers, and matters of sundry debts for supplies, etc. Later a financial committee met to discuss monetary matters affecting the board.

CHARGED WITH MANSLAUGHTER

James O'Hearn was remanded until the 9th, when he appeared yesterday morning in police court charged with manslaughter. He was the driver of the automobile that ran down and killed Matthew Pumbly at King and Church streets, Monday morning.

ILL GET HIM YET!

REQUEST DIRECT ROAD ARTHUR TO TORONTO

A large deputation from the county council of Wellington and others waited upon W. A. McLean, deputy-minister of highways, at parliament buildings yesterday regarding the proposed new road from Arthur to Toronto. They urged for the road to be built direct, or "straight" as one of the delegation remarked, instead of being diverted as asked for by some of the municipalities. Mr. McLean promised the usual consideration.

The delegates were introduced by W. Clark Chambers, provincial member for West Wellington, U. Richardson, M.P. for East Wellington, was also present to support the request.

There is reported from the Soldiers' Comforts office appreciation for the gift of \$156, to be used for the benefit of returned men in the hospitals, proceeds from the musical minstrel show held in the Wawa Hotel, Lake of Bays, Ont.

"DOPE" PEDDLER WAS HEAVILY SENTENCED

George Badgley, "dope peddler" who was found guilty in police court yesterday morning of supplying morphine to wounded soldiers, was sentenced to serve one year, less one day at Burwash and to pay a fine of \$500 and costs. In event of the fine not being paid the prisoner is to have another year added to his sentence. John Kelly, arrested with Badgley, is too sick from drugs to serve a term and a fine of \$100 and costs or 30 days at the farm was imposed upon Min. Emma Burch, a dope fiend, testified against the prisoners, as did Kelly's wife. By turning King's evidence the Burch woman escaped a sentence. Her husband, Douglas Burch, was fined \$300 and costs or six months, on a charge of having cocaine in his possession.
