

He was then elected to Congre-iss a Republican six times in succession serving from 1871, to 1881, when he too his seat as United States Senator, havin been chosen to fill the vacancy caused in the resignation of James G. Blaine. He was re-elected in 1888 for a full term. He has been a member of the Republican N tional Committee since 1872, and earnest supported James G. Blaine for the Pre-dency in 1884. He was made a trustee Bowdoin in 1880, and received the degr of LL, D. from Bates in 1881. He is al a member of the Senate Committee on Fr eign Relations, having once been chn man, and brings to the commission experience of nearly thirty years' serv in Congress.
