WOMAN TERRIBLY BURNED Mrs. Hannah Badger in a Critical Condition From Burns Received From a Cook Stove.

Hamilton, Aug. 18.—(Special.)—Mrs. Hannah Badger, 11 William-street, was slightly burned yesterday afternoon. Her clothes caught fire from the cook stove and in an instant she was enveloped in flames. Before they were extinguished her hands and the upper part of her body were terribly burned. She was taken to the General Hospital in a critical condition. Word has been received here of the death in Jersey City of J. V. Heidenberg, formerly foreman in the Edison Electric Works at Hamilton and Peterborough. The funeral of the late Charles H. Dempster this afternoon was largely attended by members of the I.O.P.F. Rev. Boaters are Not Surrendering in Response to Proclamations Between Gen. Botha and Gen. Kitchener—Beginning of the Week Sees the Situation Unchanged.

London, Aug. 18.—(Tribune Cable.)—The effect of Lord Kitchener's rather Mr. Chamberlain's proclamation is not distinctly noticeable in South Africa. There are rumors of a resumption of negotiations between Gen. Botha and Gen. Kitchener, but these are probably fictitious, like the vagaries respecting Mr. Kruger's letters of marque to protest against the number of volunteers who are not increased, but possibly it is premature to look for a result of this kind when the proclamation allows several weeks in which the Boers can reconcile themselves to the idea of submission. Chamberlain's speech to parliament to the effect that he will not withhold belligerent rights and change the character of the military operations. There has been no material change in the situation during the last week. BOYHO TO THE SUNDER. London, Aug. 17.—The Sun today says it hears that the concentration of Gen. The Sun adds that the government is not at all disposed to entertain the suggestion that Lord Buller, now on his way back to the Orange River, is in his pocket the draft of a message to the Orange River, and plans for the future government of the annexed territories.

118,497 IN REFUGEE CAMPS. London, Aug. 18.—An official paper just issued, shows that there were 118,497 persons in the refugee camps in South Africa on July 31.

Explosion Kills Three. Youngstown, Ohio, Aug. 18.—An explosion of ten tons of molten metal in the plant of the National Steel Company resulted in the death of three workmen and an injury of several others.

FOUR KILLED. Chicago, Aug. 17.—By the collision of a trolley car on the 47th-street line with a rapidly moving passenger train on the Pennsylvania road to-night, four people were killed outright and 11 injured. The names of those who lost their lives are: Frederick O. Edwards, 37 years of age; Harriet Sutcliffe, 50 years of age; Ella B. O'Leary, aged 29; and an unidentified woman, 25 years of age.
