



### SANATORIUM SOCIETY HAS JUST ENDED BEST YEAR IN ITS HISTORY

Mrs. John Stevely Elected as New President.

MAKING GOOD PROGRESS

Nurses Made Nearly Four Thousand Visits in Past Twelve Months.

The annual meeting of the Woman's Sanatorium Aid Society was held at the residence of Mrs. J. C. Judd, Ridout street, Thursday afternoon, when the reports for the year were received. The nurses' report showed great activity, 1,260 patients taking advantage of the free examination and treatment at the clinic in Victoria Hospital. The number of nurses' visits for the year totaled 3,951. Number of families suffering from tuberculosis, 368.

Charles White, who has conducted a most successful paper campaign for the past three years, was given a standing vote of thanks for her untiring efforts in this work. The treasurer's report showed an exenditure of \$1,008 for the year, which did not include the Christmas cheer.

The officers were re-elected by acclamation, as follows: President, Mrs. John Stevely; first vice-president, Mrs. Ziegler: second vice-president, Mr. John Stevenson; third vice-president. Mrs. Wm. Waugh; secretary, Mrs. B. C. McCann; treasurer, Mrs. A. B. Greer. Secretary's Report.




