FIGHTS SIXTY AIRMEN ALONE GETS 10 BUT IS WOUNDED

Exploit of a New Brunswick Aviator Most Daring of the War.

ESCAPE WAS MIRACULOUS

Performed Every Stunt Known To Outwit the German Flyers.

OTTAWA, Nov. 14.—Canadian military headquarters in London announce that the aviator, who, while desperately wounded, fought sixty enemy machines single-handed, destroying four and bringing down six, is a Canadian, Major W. G. Barker, D.S.O., (two bars), D.F.C., M.C., (with bar), and the Italian cross of honor.

Major Barker, who is reported dangerously wounded, went overseas with a New Brunswick unit.

The story of Major Barker's fight with a horde of enemy planes relates the most astounding individual aerial combat on record. While our aviators were harrying the enemy's retreat, Barker, when over the forest of Morval, encountered a two-seater German plane at an altitude of 2,000 feet to evade the fire of British "archies" and climbed and brought it down. Immediately a whistling bullet whirled over him; bullets something past through his machine, and so that his machine spun uncontrolled. Recovering his senses and control, he found himself hemmed in on all sides. He shot to the attack and a chance shot shattered his thigh bone. He faltered and dived seemingly to his death.

In recovering consciousness he found himself upon another fifteen enemy machine swooping about him like hounds. One bullet shattered his left elbow. Enemy machines were now swarming as thick as gnats on a summer day. He dived, right of his foes hurtling like stones in pursuit. Wounded and half fainting, yet with his brain still alert and cool, he realized that his only chance of safety lay in sheer audacity. Enemy craft flew above and about him like a cloud of vultures until those watching below counted between 50 and 60. In the thick of them, this amazing Canadian performed every "stunt" ingenuity, sharpened by necessity, could devise.

He escaped the incredible daring of his offensive tactics. For upwards of ten minutes he banked, looped, spun, nose dived, climbed again in a multi-tude of "star" tricks until he was in the way right back of the vultures. Then the rest of the flock spread and about him like a cloud of vultures until those watching below counted between 50 and 60. In the thick of them, this amazing Canadian performed every "stunt" ingenuity, sharpened by necessity, could devise.

NORWAY HAS LARGE CLAIM TO PRESENT FOR SUB ACTIVITIES

831 Vessels Sunk, 33 Damaged and 1,120 Lives Lost.

LONDON, Nov. 14.—(British Wireless Service.)—Norway has lost during the war 831 vessels, totalling close on to one million tons, according to one official statistic. In addition, 33 vessels of approximately 60,000 tons were damaged by German submarines. One thousand one hundred and twenty lives were lost in these disasters.

TRANSPORTATION TO BE DEALT WITH

LAMBETH, Nov. 14.—Haines Simpson has been called to Detroit owing to the serious illness of his brother.

WOULD ERECT STATUE OF WILSON IN LONDON

LONDON, Nov. 14.—The newly-formed Anglo-American Society, of which the Duke of Connaught is president, has decided to ask President Wilson to honor the society by allowing it to erect his statue in London simultaneously with the statues of Washington and Lincoln, which have already been offered by the United States. The resolution passed by the society stated that the statue would be a "memorial to the services to humanity in the time of the great war."

Vicount James Bryce, former British ambassador to the United States, is deputy president of the society, while Premier Lloyd George, former Premier of Great Britain, is president.

RUMANIAN ARMY IS MOBILIZED FULLY AND WANTS TRANSYLVANIA

ZURICH, Switzerland, Nov. 14.—Rumania's ultimatum to Count Karolyi's government to evacuate Transylvania was preceded by a general mobilization of the Rumanian army and the arrival of an Allied army from the Balkans in Rumania. The entry of the Rumanian army into Transylvania was announced from Vienna yesterday.

REV. T. BEVERLY SMITH DEAD. TORONTO, Nov. 14.—Rev. T. Beverly Smith, for a year and a half, agency secretary for the Upper Canada Society, died tonight at his home, West Toronto, at the age of 78. He was a member of the late St. John's Anglican Church, three sons and one daughter survive him. One son is at the Royal Naval College, Esquimaux.
